PROJECT THEMES

This year, fourteen organizations reported on their sustainability plans and implementation projects, showcasing best practices and innovative methods. Below are several projects that received recognition during the 2022 Summit.

Linde PLC responded to a hydrogen supply shortage at their Niagara Falls site by innovating their processes. Running 3 out of 4 compressors at 80% capacity proved more efficient and increased site resilience with a standby compressor. This adaptation resulted in substantial energy and water savings, amounting to 11,267 MW and 2,253,357 gallons annually, respectively. Additionally, the company achieved economic savings of over \$400,000 per year as a positive outcome of their innovative measures.

Providence Farm Collective Spring 2021

In 2020, **Rich Product's** awarded a \$10,000 grant to the Providence Farm Collective, collaborating with the Somali community to combat food insecurity in WNY. This funding allowed the collective to expand and relocate, significantly increasing their impact. Through partnerships with 25 community organizations, they distributed 10,602 pounds of locally grown and purchased produce, valued at \$16,375. The expansion created 12 staff positions, including 7 from farming communities, and facilitated 14 farm incubators with 16 farmers. Rich's further extended their support by awarding an additional 3-year grant to the collective in the following year.

In the of Summer 2021, **LED Energy Solutions** implemented a project in the City of Dunkirk that effectively retrofitted every city streetlight and lights in city buildings and properties with LED lighting. This initiative not only supported the local economy by utilizing local electricians, contractors, and product suppliers but cut the City of Dunkirk's kilowatt hour per year usage in half, ultimately saving city taxpayers roughly \$250,000 annually in electricity costs.






